The Cody Wyoming Temple was announced in October 2021 and will be the third temple dedicated in Wyoming, following the Star Valley Wyoming Temple (2016) and the Casper Wyoming Temple (2024). Set near the eastern gateway to Yellowstone National Park, the temple draws its character from the historic Sheridan Avenue in Cody's center, whose Romanesque revival architecture — found throughout Wyoming, especially in its religious buildings — inspired the temple's exterior. Its design motifs celebrate the region's natural and cultural heritage. The Indian paintbrush, Wyoming's state flower, appears throughout the art glass in vibrant red blooms set against green foliage, while stylized patterns drawn from the area's distinctive "Sheridan-style" leatherwork and the aesthetic movement root the temple in the story of Wyoming's founding and settlement.

EXTERIOR FEATURES

The Cody Wyoming Temple is a steel-framed modular structure clad in glass-fiber-reinforced concrete, fabricated by Unlimited Designs of North Salt Lake, Utah, and installed by JHA Steel of Justin, Texas. Crenellations and bracketed detailing are drawn directly from the buildings that front Cody's historic Sheridan Avenue, while trimmed arches and simplified classical features echo the Romanesque revival style. Rising 100 feet, 11 inches from the ground to the top of the spire, the temple stands as a landmark on its 4.69-acre site, enclosed by a Majestic-style metal fence with glass-fiber-reinforced concrete columns. The cupola was fabricated by Munns Manufacturing of Tremonton, Utah, and installed by JHA Steel.

The plants surrounding the temple were provided by Glacier Nursery of Kalispell, Montana, and installed by LandWorks LLC of Cody, Wyoming.

INTERIOR FEATURES

FLOORING: Nylon carpet is used throughout the general areas of the temple, fabricated by Milliken of Spartanburg, South Carolina; Bentley Mills of City of Industry, California; and Shaw Industries of Dalton, Georgia, and installed by

Commercial Flooring Systems of Salt Lake City, Utah. Wool area rugs add warmth and texture in select rooms, crafted by Rugs International of Cartersville, Georgia, and installed by The Haskell Company of Salt Lake City, Utah.

STONE: Porcelain tile serves as the temple's primary interior stone, its warm reds and greens echoing the Indian paintbrush motif. The stonework was fabricated by Global Stone of Tegucigalpa, Honduras, and Wilsonart of Temple, Texas, and installed by Global Stone & Tile of Vineyard, Utah. Tile was supplied by Daltile of Dallas, Texas; Florida Tile of Lawrenceburg, Kentucky; and Porslim of Sassuolo, Italy.

LIGHTING: The temple's decorative lighting combines steel fixtures with a satin brass finish, hand-blown glass and both clear and frosted crystal. Crystal chandeliers and sconces illuminate the temple's sacred spaces, creating an atmosphere of sacred elegance. The lighting was fabricated by Preciosa of the Czech Republic and installed by Knight Electric of Laurel, Montana.

MILLWORK: Quarter-sawn sapele is used throughout the temple's interior, with paint-grade sapele in the celestial and sealing rooms. The millwork carvings take their style from the "Sheridan-style" leatherwork that originated in the area, a tradition seen in the region's handcrafted belts, saddles and bags. The millwork was fabricated by Dovecreek Wood Products of Chula Vista, California, and installed by Hurst Custom Homes of Grantsville, Utah.

ART GLASS: The temple's art glass was designed by Edifice Design + Architecture and features the Indian paintbrush, Wyoming's state flower, viewed from above to showcase the geometric order of nature. Its vibrant red blossoms and green foliage carry the regional motif into the temple's

most sacred spaces. The art glass was fabricated and installed by Timeless Art Glass of Springville, Utah.

DOORS AND HARDWARE: The interior doors are quarter-sawn sapele with a satin brass finish and decorative art glass, fabricated by Dovecreek Wood Products of Chula Vista, California, and installed by Hurst Custom Homes of Grantsville, Utah. The exterior doors were fabricated and installed by Jenkins Glass of Ammon, Idaho. The door hardware was fabricated by Fersa of Buenos Aires, Argentina, and Top Knobs of Branchburg, New Jersey, and installed by Hurst Custom Homes.

BAPTISMAL FONT RAILINGS: The baptismal font railings continue the foliage motif used in the art glass in a simple, stylized form, carrying the Indian paintbrush imagery into the baptistry. Crafted from aluminum with a satin brass finish, tempered glass and Luce film, the railings were fabricated and installed by Wiemann Metalcraft of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

DECORATIVE PAINT: The decorative paint draws the temple's design elements into harmony, combining the repeating "stamp" patterns of Sheridan-style leather, the stylized forms of the aesthetic movement, and wildflowers and foliage that complement the Indian paintbrush. The temple's glass-reinforced gypsum ceilings incorporate decorative paint and gold leaf. The decorative paint was fabricated and installed by Allen's Commercial Arts of Logan, Utah.

ORIGINAL ARTWORK: The temple's original artwork includes Mark McKenna's "Heart Mountain Glory," Jim Wilcox's "Opening Day at Lower Falls" and John Horejs' "August Morning — Mount Moran."



ELDER K. BRETT NATTRESS

General Authority Seventy



Church Service: Elder K. Brett Nattress was sustained as a General Authority Seventy of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 2, 2016. At the time

of his call, he had been serving as president of the Arizona Gilbert Mission. Elder Nattress currently serves at Church headquarters. He previously served for five years in the Pacific Area Presidency.

Elder Nattress has served in numerous Church callings, including full-time missionary in the California Sacramento Mission, ward Young Men president, bishop, stake Young Men president, stake president, Area Seventy and mission president.

General Authority Seventy



Church Service: Elder Ricardo P. Giménez was sustained as a General Authority Seventy of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 6, 2019, at age 47. At the time of his call, he had been serving as a counselor in a stake presidency. Since being called as a General Authority, he has served as an assistant to the North America West Area Presidency, president of the California San Diego Mission, and assistant executive director in the Priesthood and Family Department and the Missionary Department. Elder Giménez currently serves at Church headquarters as a counselor in the United States Central Area Presidency.

Elder Giménez has served in several Church callings, including full-time missionary in the Chile Concepción Mission, high counselor, counselor in a ward Young Men presidency, counselor in a bishopric, bishop, stake president, mission president, and Area Seventy in the Chile and South America South Areas.

Professional Life: Elder Giménez received an undergraduate degree in accounting and auditing from the University of Santiago, Chile, in 1997. Church Service: Elder Jeremiah J. Morgan was sustained as a General Authority Seventy of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at the April 2026 general conference. At the time of his call, he had been serving as a ministering secretary and elders quorum instructor for the Hodge Park Ward.

Elder Morgan has served in a number of Church callings, including full-time missionary in the Micronesia Guam Mission, branch president, bishop, high counselor, communication specialist, stake president and Area Seventy.

Professional Life: Elder Morgan earned a Bachelor of Science degree in political science from the University of Central Missouri in 1995 and a Juris Doctor degree from Brigham Young University in 1998. He worked as a judicial clerk for the US Federal Court of Appeals from 1998 to 1999 and then as an attorney for Bryan Cave LLP from 1999 to 2009.
